### 2:10-3:00 P.M. II. ACTION DISCUSSION

**1.** Determination of Use for One Time Funds Received from SDCWA for Lawsuit Proceeds.

*Background:* The San Diego County Water Authority prevailed in one of their lawsuits against Metropolitan Water District of Southern California for the overcharging of fees in 2010-2012. This win resulted in a one time payment to the District for \$85,129.98.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the District place these funds into the Rate Stabilization Fund to help offset future rate increases.

2. Proposed Resolution Amending the Rules and Regulations Governing Water Service (Schedule of Rates, Rental, Fees, Deposits and Charges Section 14.7, 15.3.1 and 19.4).

Background: The San Diego County Water Authority (CWA) adopted new System Capacity and Water Treatment Capacity Charges and Fixed Cost Charges (Customer Service, Storage, Supply Reliability, Readiness-to-Serve and Peak Day Capacity) to become effective January 1, 2022. Both the System Capacity and Water Treatment charges are assessed to any new meter that is installed within the Yuima General District and forwarded to CWA when collected. These charges cover CWA's cost for conveyance, and treatment of imported water delivered to Yuima from CWA. Additionally, the Fixed Costs Charges are direct passthrough charges that are passed through to each District customer based on the same methodology used by the Water Authority to charge the District (Customer Rolling Average Usage). Finally, the Conveyance (Wheeling) rate is the charge assessed to any individual or entity wanting to use Yuima infrastructure to transfer water from one location to another within the General District only (not IDA).

*Recommendation:* That, should the Board Agree, they approve the Resolution as presented.

3. Approval of the Third Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding for Developing a Groundwater Sustainability Plan for the San Luis Rey Valley Groundwater Basin.

Background: An amendment to the MOU is necessary to add the Pauma Valley Municipal Water District and the San Luis Rey Municipal Water District to the Groundwater Sustainability Agency. The addition of these agencies will allow full coverage of the groundwater basin, closing any white spaces created upon the County of San Diego's withdraw from the GSA.

Recommendation: Approve and authorize the President to sign the Third Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding for the Development of a Groundwater Sustainability Plan for the San Luis Rey Groundwater Basin.



### 1. Joint Powers Fire Report

Fire Captain Eli Bakkela from CAL Fire Reported that Station 70 has a total of 985 incidents from January 1 to September 30, 2021. Personnel from Station 70 spent the last three months traveling the state going to multiple different large fires. One of the engine crews was at the Dixie Fire in the area of Chester California. The crew spent over a month fighting the Dixie Fire. Station 70 continues to train firefighters in all aspects of the fire service. Station 70 recently trained on a structure's fire ventilation. The station continues to inspect properties for defensible space. There have been a total of 600 property inspections for the year. The new fire stations project should start after the first of the year.





### Pooled Money Investment Account Monthly Portfolio Composition (1) 09/30/21 \$179.1 billion







SUBJECT: Update to the District's Rules and Regulations Governing Water Service

### **BACKGROUND**

### San Diego County Water Authority Capacity Charges:

The San Diego County Water Authority has adopted new rates for the 2022 calendar year. The Capacity Charge, which is the fee charged to all new meter installations, has increased 0.3%.

### San Diego County Water Authority Fixed Cost Pass Through Charges:

The Water Authority has also recalculated the new Fixed Cost charges based the District's rolling average demand. The Fixed Cost pass through charges consist of the following fees: Customer Service, Storage, Supply Reliability, Readiness-to-Serve, and Peak Demand Capacity. These Fixed Costs are considered a direct pass through to Yuima customers using the same methodology the Water Authority uses to determine the District's charges.

### Conveyance (Wheeling) Rate:

In accordance with the District's Rules & Regulations governing Water Service §19.4, first adopted on April 28, 2014 and the Supply Conveyance and Exchange revised in August of 202; the Conveyance and Exchange rate shall be adjusted annually each year, based on a 10-year rolling average of the year-end audited District costs. The fair and reasonable cost recovery calculation components include, but are not limited to:

- a) Water distribution system capital, operational and maintenance costs;
- b) Water distribution system indirect support costs including, but not limited to, billing, meter reading and similar services;
- c) Water system value of capital assets (with annual CCI increase), net of depreciation and the replacement and refurbishment costs attributable to the proposed use;
- d) Water treatment costs; and
- e) General and Administrative costs

### RECOMMENDATION

That the Board approve the proposed changes to the District's Rules & Regulations Governing Water Service.

### 19. Section 19 – SUPPLY CONVEYANCE AND EXCHANGE POLICY

### **19.1** GENERAL

California Water Code §1810 provides that neither the state, nor any regional or local public agency may deny a bona fide transferor of water the use of a water conveyance facility (water wheeling) which has unused capacity, for the period of time for which that capacity is available, if fair compensation is paid for the use.

Fair Compensation is defined as reasonable charges incurred by the owner of the conveyance system, including capital, operation, maintenance and replacement costs, and increased costs from any necessitated purchase of supplemental power.

### **19.2** PURPOSE

The purpose of the Section is to set forth policy guidelines by which the District will address the financial and operational components of water system access, as well as impacts on water quality and current customers.

### **19.3** POLICY PRINCIPLES

Requests for access to District owned and operated water conveyance facilities (water wheeling) shall be evaluated using the following policy guidelines:

- a) Evaluation and the granting of access shall be made in a manner consistent with California water law; and
- b) The review and approval of access shall ensure no harm to existing District customers;
- c) Criteria for consideration shall serve to protect the District's financial position, operational performance, and quality of service delivered; and
- d) The District will facilitate acceptable and appropriate water system access.

### **19.4** COST RECOVERY

Cost for access to water conveyance systems shall be recovered on a uniform rate basis and include the proportionate cost of such access, encompassing all aspects of the District's integrate water distribution network.

Such costs for access shall be proportionately recovered on a per-acre-foot charge that, at a minimum, includes:

- a) Water distribution system capital, operational and maintenance costs;
- b) Water distribution system indirect support costs including, but not limited to, billing, meter reading, and similar services:
- c) Water system <u>value of capital assets (with annual CCI increase)</u>, <u>net of depreciation</u>, <u>and the replacement and refurbishment costs attributable to the proposed use</u>;
- d) Water treatment costs; and
- e) General and administrative costs.

The District shall not be responsible for other potential costs such as, but not limited to, those associated with pretreatment, environmental, or regulatory concerns, which shall be the responsibility of those wheeling water through the District's system.



### ANNEXATIONS/NEW SERVICE REQUESTS

Pauma Valley Water Company (PVWC) The PVWC annexation is being paid for with grant funds and completed by the Sacramento State Water Program. The team is currently waiting for NV5 to complete the engineering reports, including the water impact study for Yuima. The Annexation Team met virtually on October 6<sup>th</sup> and it was discussed that the team had not yet met spoken to Metropolitan or LAFCO regarding the "cherry picking" of parcels. Sean Sterchi form the SDRCB indicated that this was a fatal flaw. It was made clear that the ability to only annex the domestic parcels and not the agriculture parcels must be approved. It was also discussed that a "plan b" needs to be developed to perhaps annex in all of the parcels but only give connections to Yuima to the domestic parcels. The team is currently waiting to see what discussions with Metropolitan and LAFCO reveal.

### **DISTRICT BUSINESS**

Drought Situation —\* UPDATE: The San Diego County Water Authority enacted their Drought Contingency Plan — Level 1 at the October Board meeting. Yuima has been at Level 1 of their Drought Conditions Plan since 2016. In accordance with the plan Yuima will not increase it's drought level until mandatory restrictions / cutbacks are implemented by either the State or SDCWA. The current water situation along the Colorado River, Lake Mean and Lake Powell remain severe resulting in the first ever Lower Basin shortage and requiring cutbacks to Arizona, Nevada and Mexico. According to the Colorado River Drought Contingency Plan, once Lake Mead reaches a certain elevation, specific states will have their allocation of Colorado River supplies reduced. Beginning in 2022 Arizona, Nevada and Mexico will have a reduction in their Colorado River supply allocation. The State of California is the last state to have a reduction implemented. The reduction will occur if Lake Mead reaches the 1045' elevation

At that time, California will have their Colorado River supplies reduce by 200,000 acre feet per year. If the elevation in Lake Mead reaches 1025-foot mark, then California will have its reduction increased to 350,000 acre feet per year. The current elevation level of Lake Mead is 1067.

The month of October showed conservation efforts were increasing with a total statewide conservation of 13.2% from October 2020. However, conditions continue to worsen and is appears that blanket, mandatory reductions will be necessary.

Staff is currently working on the 2020/21 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report to be submitted to the Government Finance Officers Association by December 31, 2021.

### **REPORTING**

The District has completed the transition and enrollment process for the Permanent Special Agricultural Water Rate Program. Almost all of the agricultural customers have enrolled and will continue to receive the benefit of the discounted rate. The Board will consider a rate increase to IDA in January to ensure that the cost benefit differential is reflected in the IDA agricultural water rate.

The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) has requested that the District assist them with updating some records that are missing from their current operating permit file for Yuima. The SWRCB provided the District with a 66-page document to complete in assistance with completing their missing documents and information.

The SWRCB was advised that we would assist as our workload and time permits but that we have limited staff and many other operational requirements that take precedence. *The District continues to work on this very cumbersome and time consuming task.* 

### **Groundwater Sustainability Plan**

The draft GSP document was posted for public review and comment on November 23, 2021. The GSA held a final stakeholder outreach meeting to do a summary review of the final document and answer any questions. Official comments of the draft plan must be submitted to the District by January 7, 2022. The GSP will be brought before the Yuima Board at the January 24<sup>th</sup> meeting for approval to submit to the State by January 31, 2022.
