#### 4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

President Knutson opened the public comment period, noting that comments regarding specific agenda items would be taken up when those items are being considered. Roland Simpson enquired as to the total cost of the tank spill that occurred during the commissioning of the new Zone 4 tank; directed the board's attention to the stacked brush near the upper reach of the repaired fence; suggested that the drainage pattern in the canyon below the tank be further modified; believes that the brow ditches above the tank are constructed improperly; took issue with the construction of the new drain pipe that traverses the fill slope below the tank; and believes that immediate action should be taken in response to SB1168 which is pending in the state legislature.

Daren House and Roland Simpson commented extensively on the role of the Director of Operations in the overflow of the Zone 4 Tank during its initial hydraulic test.
