



COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Response Key Points
March 18, 2020

- **Yuima customers can expect no disruption of service associated with the Coronavirus. The Yuima Municipal Water District Board Members and staff are committed to providing safe and reliable water services to meet your public health and safety needs during this difficult time.**
- **The San Diego County Water Authority and its 24 member agencies have increased regional coordination and communication to ensure the coronavirus pandemic does not impact safe and secure water service for San Diego County.**
- **Public water supplies in the San Diego region remain safe to drink due to the numerous robust treatment processes used by local and regional water providers.**
 - There is no evidence that the virus is transmitted through treated water.
 - U.S. EPA recommends that Americans continue to use and drink tap water as usual.
 - Drinking water provided by the Water Authority and its member agencies is treated by a combination of technologies – including sedimentation, filtration and disinfection – that chemically deactivate and physically remove bacteria, viruses and other contaminants.
- **To support continued operation of critical infrastructure, the Water Authority has activated its Emergency Operations Center.**
 - THE EOC supports the need for enhanced communication between the Water Authority and its member agencies as the public health crisis evolves.
 - In addition, all member agencies have back-up plans to assist each other should key personnel be unable to work.
- **Yuima is taking additional measures to comply with State and County agencies directives.**
 - District employees are complying with social distancing requirements.
